Requirements - Austin County Fair

As a 4-H member, you are expected to attend 6 Club Meetings in order to be eligible to show at the fair. Please check with your club manager(s) to ensure that you have met this requirement or are on track for meeting the requirement. Talk with your club manager(s) if you're going to be short any meetings by the entry deadline (these will be filled out at your August Club Meeting) so that they can help provide you with options to make any meetings up. Quality Counts

"Focused on quality assurance and character education, Quality Counts is designed to teach young people the importance of displaying good character in carrying out livestock projects, and in every aspect of their lives. Quality Counts helps youth exhibitors learn the importance of using proper livestock management practices so that food quality and safety are preserved. Through a set of curricula, activities and a verification exam, livestock exhibitors understand they are contributing to the world's most nutritious and safe food supply."

Quality Counts Continued

You are required to retake the Quality Counts Verification Exam each time you move up an age category to be verified as a Junior, Intermediate, and again as a Senior. Junior are students in grades 3-5, Intermediate are students in grades 6-8, and Senior are students in grades 9-12. **EVERYONE** is required to take the verification exam if they did not receive a number under the NEW Quality Counts System last year.

Record Books

These are not only a great asset used to track project experiences, but also a great way to set goals and reflect on them. Record Book completion is also a requirement for Gold Star Award & Scholarship Applicants. The 4-H Family Guide used to construct a Record Book can be found <u>HERE</u>. This guide explains EXACTLY how a book should look and be constructed. Record Book forms can be found <u>HERE</u>, along with <u>Categories</u>, and Record Book Covers can be purchased at the Extension Office for \$6.00. Note that Record Book Forms have CHANGED this year, so please make sure to use the updated forms in the link above.

County Record Books are due to the Extension Office by Friday, June 14, 2019

Lambs/Goats that need to be validated for other major shows will order tags and validate in the fall. IF YOU PLAN ON SHOWING A STEER AT ANY MAJOR SHOW, YOU MUST VALIDATE THEM ON THIS VALIDATION DATE. Validating a Major Steer will allow that steer to show at Heart of Texas, State Fair of Texas, Fort Worth, San Antonio, San Angelo, HLSR, Austin, Rio Grande Valley, and Odessa.
