Multi-County New Landowners Series 2023

The Multi-County New Landowner Education program is a series of eight informational meetings/seminars/field days designed to make new landowners in Austin, Colorado, Fayette, & Washington Counties aware of what types of agricultural enterprises are best for their property. Participants in the program will hear from experts in various fields of agriculture concerning the best management practices that they can implement on their own property. This innovative program assists new landowners in understanding the concepts of rural living. Participants in the program are given exposure to ideas on raising livestock and horses, plant identification, fence building, applying pesticides, soil testing, stock pond management, pond construction, fruit and nut production, and much more. The program also serves as a way for new residents of the four counties to network and meet new people in their communities, find out what can be done on their land, what operations can be profitable, and possibly what opportunities they have to serve the community.

Programs will be held on the third Friday of the months of February through May and August through November. Each month's meeting will be held at a different location in one of the four participating counties. The meetings will begin at 1:30 p.m. with registration and last until 5p.m. The cost for the program series is \$125.00 per person, \$200.00 per couple for all eight meetings, or \$20.00 per person per meeting. Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for pesticide applicators will be offered as they are applicable. A great selection of refreshments will be provided at each session. Participants who sign up for the entire series will receive a notebook at the beginning of the series to fill with handouts and reference material that will be useful as they move forward with improvements on their property.

AUSTIN COUNTY HOG BOUNTY

Austin County Commissioners Court is offering a bounty on feral hogs. Participants will be awarded \$5 per feral hog harvested in Austin County, with biological evidence provided of harvest in the form of a pair of feral hog ears. Each pair must be placed in an individually sealed bag and dropped off at 1 of the 3 drop off locations. Three local feed stores in the county - Steinhauser's in Sealy, Linseisen's Feed & Supply in Bellville, and Lindemann Store in Industry, will serve as the drop off locations.

A limit of 20 pairs per household per month is allowed. All feral hogs must be harvested in Austin County & signed paperwork must be filled out completely to collect the bounty.

Regional Pecan Show Results

Austin County had five pecan entries move on from the

county show to the East Regional Pecan Show for the 2022 • crop year. There was a total of 93 entries from 12 different • counties. Judging was held on Wednesday, January 11th in College Station. Judges for this event were: Warren Chatwin, Keith Kubenka, Braden Tondre, and Xinwang Wang, all from USDA-ARS Pecan Genetics, and Bill Ree, Extension Entomologist (retired). 2023 CEU Applicator License Holders Allowances

Agricultural Applicators — Beginning in 2023, applicators must have all of the required CEUs to renew their private, commercial and noncommercial applicators licenses. Upon receipt of the 2023 renewal notice, submit the appropriate renewal fee(s).

Structural Applicators—MUST have obtained ALL of their required CEUs in the calendar year preceding the calendar year in which their license expires OR they may NOT renew. If you renew without CEUs, you are subject to a \$300 penalty and/or denial of license renewal. Live interactive (proctored by camera) webinars will be allowed in 2023.

MULTI-COUNTY URBAN & HOMEOWNER SOIL TESTING CAMPAIGN

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Austin County presents the Multi-County Urban & Homeowner Soil Testing Campaign in conjunction with Colorado, Fayette, and Washington Counties. This event will run from February 1-28, 2023, and is limited to soil samples for growing flowers, gardens, turfgrasses, trees, and woody ornamentals. This campaign is made possible through the support of the Multi-County Ag Committee and is in cooperation with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Soil, Water, and Forge Testing Lab in College Station.

Soil samples submitted during this time frame will be \$8.00 for a routine analysis and \$15.00 for a routine analysis including micro-nutrients. You may pick up information, collection bags, and forms at one of the following locations around Austin County: Bellville - Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Austin County (located at 800 E Wendt St), Bellville Farm & Ranch, and Linseisen's Feed & Supply Inc; Sealy - Steinhauser's; Cat Spring - Bernardo Farm & Ranch Supply; and Industry - Lindemann's Store. Soil samples, forms, and payment should also be returned to one of these locations. Please check with your local County Extension office for their locations.

Private Application Training for 2023

If you plan on using a state limited use or state restricted use pesticide, such as Grazon P+D, 2 4-D, Weedmaster, etc., and need a license, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Austin County will be hosting several Private Applicator Training classes during 2023 at the Austin County Extension Office, 800 E Wendt St., Bellville. Books and study materials for the course may to be purchased ahead of time at the Extension Office for \$50.00. A registration fee of \$10.00 will be charged for the training. The registration fee will include the training and additional study materials. The training will begin at 1pm and conclude about 5pm, available on the following days:

- Friday, February 10, 2023
- Friday, May 5, 2023
- Friday, August 4, 2023
- Friday, November 3, 2023

The Texas Department of Agriculture, who oversees the testing and administration of Applicator Licensing, has contracted with PSI Services to administer the exam for agricultural pesticide applicator licensing. Applicants will coordinate testing with PSI at one of their 22 locations around Texas. Details on the process, locations, cost, and other pertinent information will be provided at the training to help applicants complete the licensing process. Once applicants have completed the training and passed the exam with a score of 70 or above, they will be eligible to apply for the Private Applicator License, allowing for the purchase of all state limited use and restricted use pesticides used in agriculture.
