
Cultural Arts are in the Air!

Dinner Tonight—Fruit Tacos

Let's twist-up this Taco Tuesday with some Fruit Tacos! An impressive taco to build, this recipe can be an appetizer, a snack, or a refreshing dessert.

Fruit Tacos

5 servings (2 tacos)

Ingredients:

- I large avocado sliced
- I pieces seedless cucumber cut into matchstick pieces
- 2 cups watermelon cut into matchstick pieces
- 10 jicama tortillas
- 2 Tablespoons lime juice
- I teaspoon honey
- 1/4 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/4 cup cilantro chopped

Instructions:

- I. Wash your hands and preparation area.
- 2. Rinse all produce before slicing.
- Prepare your avocado, cumber, and watermelon by slicing into matchstick pieces, or julienne cut.
- Evenly layer 2-3 pieces of avocado, cumber, and watermelon in the middle of the jicama tortilla.
- In a small bowl, mix freshly squeezed lime juice, honey, and chili powder util well blended.
- 6. Drizzle a small amount over each tortilla and sprinkle cilantro. Serve & enjoy!
